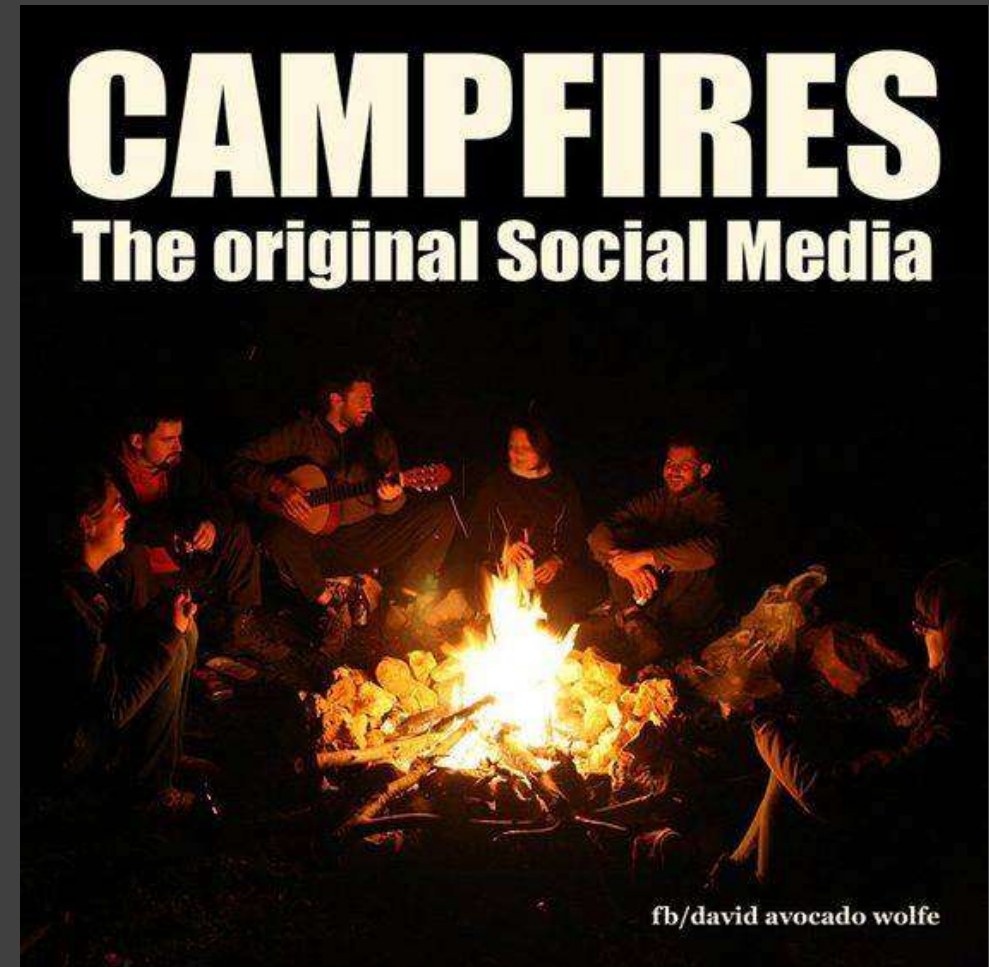

# Planning a Campfire

- Two P's
  - Planning
    - Location
    - Fire restrictions
    - Who will lead / Master of Ceremonies
    - Fire marshall
    - Plan a program / Don't wing it!
  - Presentation
    - Get songs, skits, etc from participants
    - Organize them into a program

# Parts of a Great Campfire

- Four S's
  - Showmanship
  - Songs
  - Stunts (skits, cheers, etc)
  - Stories (ghost, funny, adventure, etc)



# How to Gauge Appropriateness

**Follow the Scout Law...**

**Friendly, Courteous, Kind**

Pre-screen all parts of the campfire!

# How to Gauge Appropriateness

Politics / Religion

Race / Nationalities

Underwear

Alcohol / Drugs / Tobacco

Gender impersonation

Inside Jokes

Wasting Food / Water

# Share Your Ground Rules

- Safety first!
- Set behavior expectations
- Support for others / Courteousness
- Show where the stage is
- Remind scouts to speak loudly and towards the audience
- What goes in the fire stays in the fire
  - Who feeds the fire?
  - What can go in the fire?

# Opening Ideas

- Procession
  - Silence
  - Singing a song
- Some other way to get everyone's attention
  - Dramatic entrance of MC
  - Scout sign
  - Fire lighting



# Lighting the Fire!

- Torch walked in ceremoniously
- Battery + long wires connected to...
  - steel wool
  - a spring wedged with match heads
- Candle on a board
  - use a string to pull the lit candle under the tinder
- Flaming arrow
  - Rides on fishing line directly to the kindling.

- Always have a backup plan!



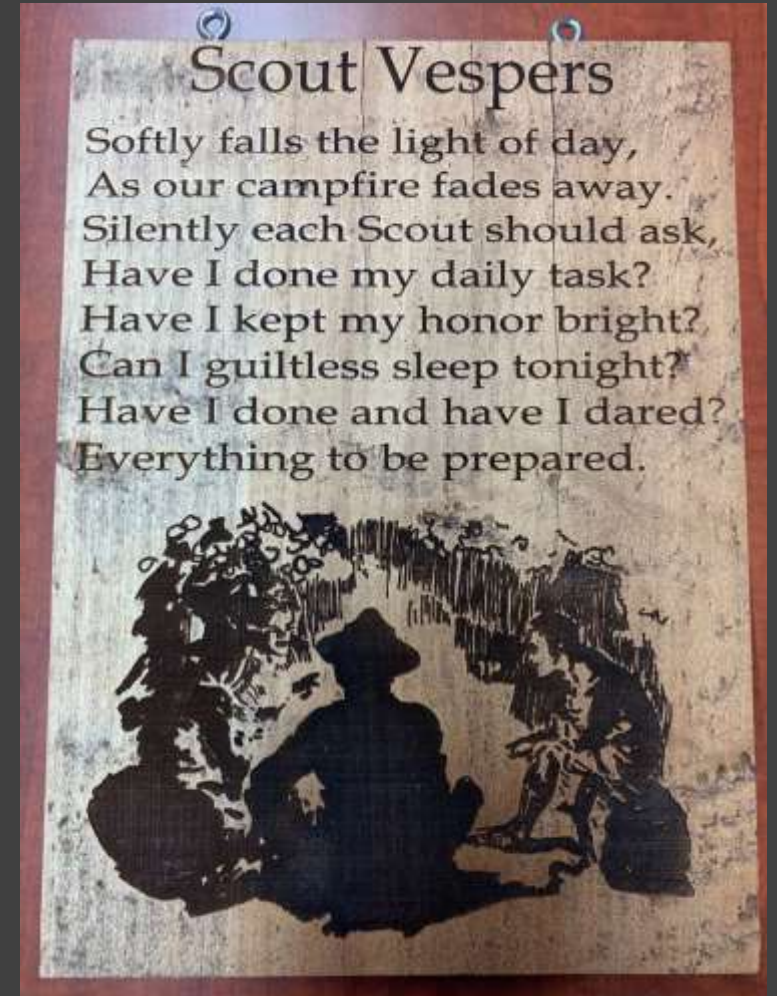
# Ceremonies

# Closing Ideas

- Scoutmaster Minute
- Scout Vespers
- Taps
  - On a trumpet or sung
- Circle
  - Right over left
  - Right hand Scout sign, left hand holds neighbor's right arm
- Scout Oath
- Scout Benediction
  - "May the Great Scoutmaster of all good Scouts be with us until we meet again."
- Roses, Thorns, and Buds



# More Fun After the Campfire!

- Cracker Barrel / S'mores
- Quiet time around the fire
- Don't forget to put out the fire!
  - Assign a person





# Tragic Mistakes of the Scouter

- Not practicing
- Not speaking loudly enough
- Not facing the audience
- Next skit/song/story not ready when the audience is

# Ideas to Liven Up Campfires

- Look for ways to have long breaks in your program
  - Recurring Themes
  - Short jokes
  - Guy in dinosaur costume
  - Second MC
  - Walk-ons



# Ideas to Liven Up Campfires

- For Cub programs:
  - Don't forget to involve parents!
  - Scouts are more likely to feel brave if they see adults/leaders/parents showing that it is ok!



# What if We Cannot Have a Campfire?

- Rain – Under Shelter
- Fire Restriction – Lanterns / Water bottles
- Inside / Short Duration – Fake Fire

# How To Be Awesome

- Have fun!
- Enthusiasm
- Speak loudly & clearly
- Variation
- Simple costumes
- Consider lighting
- Length
- Rehearse, rehearse, rehearse!
- Be prepared



# Not Just for Campfires

- Skits are great for skills training:
  - Good/bad campsite choices
  - Outdoor Code
- Scouts Own / Interfaith Services

# How to Prepare Groups for Singing

- Make it a habit / Practice
- Explain the type of song / Make space / Position
- Utilize Repeat After Me / Do as I Do Songs
- Teach short verses
- Provide copies of longer songs / Cue cards
- Open to a page of a shared songbook



# What About Instruments?

- Encourages interest in music
- Increase participation in program
- Add diversity to music
- Consider instrument vs. size
- Guitars & Ukuleles
- Trumpets & Bugles
