Day Camp Rules

(Follow the Scout Oath and Scout Law first and foremost)

1. Buddy System – We will be using the buddy system at ALL times during camp. Buddies **MUST** stay together. This includes going to the restroom OR to see the medic.
2. Scouts will be assigned to a Den (for Tigers, Wolves, Bears, and Webelos) or a Patrol (for Arrows of Light). Scouts are always to **STAY** with their Den or Patrol.
3. Scouts must have parent or guardian permission and sign out to leave the camp any time Day Camp is in session and must check out with the Nurse or Medic if medications were brought.
4. **NO RUNNING IN CAMP** unless it is required as part of an activity.
5. No climbing, horseplay, or fighting on tables, benches, or anywhere else in camp.
6. Stay out of areas not marked for Day Camp use.
7. No tobacco, alcohol, or drugs in camp. This includes e-cigarettes, vapes, etc.
8. Practice Leave No Trace skills by disposing of your trash in trash cans.
9. Scouts will be respectful to all staff, adults, other Scouts, and their property.
10. No disrespectful or rude language will be tolerated during camp.
11. **No** open toed/open heeled shoes for either kids OR adults.
12. Scouts must remain in uniform always. Changing clothing should be done in private.
13. Follow the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace Principles by staying on established paths and not creating new trails.

Emergency Drill Procedures

Three Long Horn Blasts - Shut down all activities. Gather youth. Move youth to Flag station for muster (headcount). Station Staff leave last after all youth evacuated.

Once on location, take head count of all youth and adults with your Den. If ALL accounted for, have everyone take a seat and wait for further instruction. In the event of inclement weather, we will have the Dens take shelter under the cooking shelter. In the event of fire in the campgrounds requiring evacuation, we will have ALL camp attendees, including staff, go to the parking lot, load youth into all available vehicles and transport them to Safeway, 26916 Maple Vly Hwy, Maple Valley, WA 98038. There we will get another head count and begin calling families.

Day Camp Directives

General

- Recycle items in appropriate containers. Clean Den areas daily.
- List of achievements will be provided to Camp Coordinators/Committee Chairs/Cubmasters.
- Camp certificates and patches will be sorted by pack and not camp den. If Pack is not at campfire, certificates will be delivered to attendees directly..
- Water coolers are for drinking water, NOT for cooling heads.
- NO dogs in camp either during camp OR at campfire. Service animals are permissible but must be certified/registered.
- Camp starts NO EARLIER than 815am. Adults MUST bring their Scout to the meeting area at the flag in the morning and pick them up from Den Walkers in the afternoon.
- Families will be responsible for their Scout when flag is over on Friday. During campfire, please keep your children with you. Wandering children in camp are discouraged.

Den Leaders

- Feel free to decorate your den area according to the theme.
- Be on time to your stations. Do **NOT** leave your station before the second horn. IF you have extra time at your station, please practice your den yell or skit.
- The Scouts are to do the work at all stations by themselves UNLESS the Scout has special needs necessitating assistance.
- Camp projects are **NOT** for den chiefs, den walkers, or station assistants. A limited number of projects may be available in the camp store for a cost.
- Attendance must be logged before opening flag EACH morning so that we may be sure that all Scouts are present and accounted for.
- If **YOU** are leaving camp before end of day, be sure to sign out at headquarters.
- ALL visitors must sign in AND sign out at headquarters.
- Den totes MUST be returned to the Quartermaster on Friday afternoon.
- If you are having trouble with a youth, do not hesitate to bring them to headquarters if necessary.
- We are all here to have FUN! Smile, laugh, and let the kids know YOU are having a great time. It will only enhance their experience!
- Bathrooms are for biological body wastes and toilet paper ONLY.
