Course Descriptions:

* Courses with an asterisk are official position training Attend as many classes as desired.

Scout Led Troop- If you want a truly cool troop that does everything Scouting is supposed to do and offer, then you need to let the *youth* lead. Come learn why and how. This course was developed and will be taught by a scout. **This class is great for all Arrow of Light parents and leaders; all Scouts BSA parents and Leaders, and Scouts BSA youth are welcome.**

*Troop Committee Training- Troop committee training is essential training for a Scouts BSA parent committee member. Want a troop that functions well, where the leaders are supported and don't burn out? One where the youth have so many great opportunities for quality fun? That all starts with a great troop committee. Come Find out how and why. This course is great for all Troop parents and leaders, as well as Arrow of Light parents.

Outdoors in *Every* Weather- Living here we have honest seasons with hot- hot, mighty wind, and below freezing temps and snow. Don't wait for a 70 degree, no wind, clear day to go outside. Come and learn how to be happy, comfortable and safe in every weather eventuality. "Be prepared" is not just something we say, it is something we do. Come learn how to be outside for more fun. This course is great for parents and leaders and is open to Scouts BSA youth.

* Pack Committee Training- Being a Committee Member is for every parent who has only a bit of time to give but wants the best den and pack program possible. Did you know that the Cub Master is only responsible for the pack meetings and checking in on the den leaders? Who does the rest? The Pack Committee. Come and learn all about the little pieces that Eit together to bring Cub Scouting to life. All Cub parents and Cub leaders are welcome!

First Aid- This is a full course in all the skills you may need to offer help to someone from scrapes to dislocations. Learn bandaging to turn anyone into a mummy, or to rescue and secure an injury, poisons, trauma, etc. This 5-hour class is taught by an official First Aid instructor with a lot of experience. **Anyone over the age of 15 is welcome. There is limited space for this class.**

* Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops or "ILST" – The purpose of this course is to teach youth leaders about troop organization and give youth leaders the tools they need to lead, including communicating effectively, planning, and the EDGE method. It teaches servant leadership, what each leadership position on the troop is supposed to do, and more. This course is a required prerequisite for NYLT. It is *the* essential leadership course for all Scouts BSA Patrol Leader Councils (PLC). Every troop should offer this course 1-2 times a year – but if your troop is small, unfamiliar with the course, or simply wants to join a larger event, this is a great opportunity! This course is designed for Scouts BSA PLC teams and their SM/ASM. (4 hours)

Knots and Knives for Cub Scouts- Cubs look forward to learning these skills. It is a BIG deal but sometimes parents and leaders don't quite feel comfortable teaching these things. If this is you, join in for this great class and we'll untie all your (stomach) knots and let you safely use sharp things. **This course is best for Cub parents and leaders.**

- * Troop Committee Training- This course is for every Scouts BSA parent! It may also be appropriate for parents of Arrow of Light scouts, as well as ASMs and SMs. Why is this the perfect class for all those folks? Because it covers what a troop committee does as a whole and as individuals. A troop has 2 sides: the Scout Master Corps made of SMs and ASMs, and the Committee. The committee does all the tasks that do not involve the scouts directly. This includes advancement, boards of review, making reservations, and managing med forms and troop equipment. Got a bit of time to lend a hand? Pick a task and be a part of the support network of the troop, the Committee! Being a part of the committee allows for a high-quality experience in scouting for all.
- *Den Chief Training- This course is intended for Scouts BSA youth who are interested in becoming a Den Chief. Scouts who just crossed over from Cub Scouts, or older scouts in need of a leadership position are great candidates for this class. Being a Den Chief is a great help to den leaders and Packs. As a Den Chief, you set an example and bring energy, fun, skills, and build a connection to your troop. First, take the required online course at https://www.scouting.org/training/youth/den-chief-training/. Then join this class to get all the tips and tricks of a great Den Chief. This class is for any Scouts BSA youth.

Pinewood Derbies and Rain Gutter Regattas- These two events are fun, creative, and unforgettable. Each event involves building a craft (a car or boat) and racing it in friendly competition. But how do you make it fair, exciting, and smooth? This class covers everything from crafting tips to race setup, judging, troubleshooting, and maximizing fun for everyone. **This class is perfect for Cub Scout parents and leaders.**

Scouting for Youth with Special Needs- Maybe you have youth with Downs Syndrome, Asperger's, Autism, ADHD, ADD, sight limited, deaf or another special need. Scouting is for every child but how do you make that so? If you've got questions, we may have answers. From special merit badge substitutions, extended age allowances, the Ability Digest publication (the official stuff) to social interactions and fun for everyone, this class will be helpful. This class is intended for all parents and leaders of any program.

* Cub Den Leader Training- This is the position specific training for Cub Scout Den Leaders. Come discover what Cub Scouting is all about – how to plan engaging meetings, prevent behavior issues, maximize fun for you and your Cubs, and find the support you need along the way. Whether you're new or already "trained" online, you're welcome to join us! You'll learn a lot, have fun, and connect with real people who share stories, answer questions, and bring the spirit of Cub Scouting to life. After all, "If it's not fun, it's not done!" This 3-hour course is for all Cub Scout parents and leaders.

Dutch Oven Cooking- Come and take this yummy course if you have always wondered what all the cast iron (or aluminum) fuss is about. Learn how to care for this wonderful pot and how to cook in and on it. How for example do you bake a pie in it? Birthday cake? Pizza? Stew? Thanksgiving in 1 pot? You can do it all! **This 3-hour course is for all interested parents and leaders. This class has limited space, so register early.**

GREAT Campfires- What comes to mind when you think about camping? Chances are, it's the campfire – a memorable and magical part of the experience. But what happens when there's

a fire ban? With or without a fire, you can still create an amazing campfire program filled with songs, skits, stories, jokes, and even desserts. It can be loud or quiet, silly or deeply moving. Come learn how to create that magic! This class is open to all parents and leaders in any Scouting program.

Successful Combined (coed) Troops and Linked Troops- In 2024 National launches a co-ed "Combined Troop" pilot program. Come and hear from a leader from a troop participating in the pilot program. You will also learn about "Linked Troops", which are a girl Scout BSA Troop and a boy Scouts BSA Troop share a committee and sometimes participate in joint activities. What are the benefits and challenges, what should you plan for? This class is intended for Arrow of Light parents so they can plan for when their scout crosses over, and for Scouts BSA parents, committee members and leaders.

Recruiting New Members! Let's be successful. - If you're attending this training, you already know how wonderful Scouting is, and that everyone ought to get the chance to be involved. Recruitment is essential — and it starts with outreach. Cub Scout packs can host traditional flyer and join nights, do you know how to make them truly effective? There are many other ways to recruit Cubs, and Scouts BSA troops welcome more than just bridging AOLS — they welcome new middle and high school youth too. Without consistent, effective outreach, your pack or troop may struggle to grow and thrive. Don't let that happen. Join us to learn new recruitment stretegies and share success stories. This class is for all Cub parents, leaders and Scouts BSA parents and leaders.

Life to Eagle- The path from Life Scout to Eagle doesn't have to be a mystery. Many Star and Lie Scouts aren't sure what becoming an Eagle really involves. Yes, there's a project – but what does that mean? What else is needed? And what roles do parents and leaders play? This course breaks it all down; the eagle project process, including proposals, plans reports, and letters of recommendation, merit badge and leadership requirements, and tips to avoid common pitfalls on the trail to Eagle. This course is for all Scouts BSA Star and Life youth and their parents and leaders.
