The Scout Oath:

On my Honor, I will do my best to do my duty to God and my country and to obey the Scout Law; to help other people at all times; to keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.

The Scout Law: (A Scout is:)

TRUSTWORTHY A Scout tells the truth. He or she keeps his or her promises. Honesty is a part of his or her code of

conduct. People can always depend on him or her.

LOYAL A Scout is true to his or her family, friends, Scout leaders, school, nation, and world.

A Scout is concerned about other people. He or she willingly volunteers to help others without

HELPFUL expecting payment or reward.

A Scout is a friend to all. He or she is a brother or sister to other Scouts. The scout seeks to understand **FRIENDLY**

others. He or she respects those with ideas and customs that are different from his or her own.

A Scout is polite to everyone regardless of age or position. He or she knows that good

COURTEOUS

manners make it easier for people to get along together.

A Scout understands there is strength in being gentle. He or she treats others as he or she wants to be **KIND**

treated. The Scout does not harm or kill anything without reason.

A Scout follows the rules of his or her family, school, and troop. He or she obeys the laws of his or her **OBEDIENT**

community and country. If the Scout thinks these rules and laws are unfair, he or she tries to have

them changed in an orderly manner rather than disobey them.

A Scout looks for the bright side of life. He or she cheerfully does tasks that come his or her way. **CHEERFUL**

The Scout tries to make others happy.

A Scout works to pay his or her way and to help others. He or she saves for the future. The Scout protects **THRIFTY**

and conserves natural resources. He or she carefully uses time and property.

A Scout can face danger even if he or she is afraid. The Scout has the courage to stand for what he or she **BRAVE**

thinks is right even if others laugh at or threaten him or her.

A Scout keeps his or her body and mind fit and clean. He or she goes around with those who believe **CLEAN**

in living by these same ideals. The Scout helps keep his home and community clean.

A Scout is reverent toward God. He or she is faithful in his or her religious duties. He or she **REVERENT**

respects the beliefs of others.
