## **Instructions:** Scouts should be in car size patrols with family members or one to two other scouts. Each team should select up to 10 locations and plan an economical route. A GPS or GPS App (not Google Maps) should be used to find the Latitude and Longitude locations. Google Map can be use for the locations with addresses or location names.

Once your route is mapped out, go to your first location. Many, but not all locations will have a marker of some kind indicating the Scout how's Eagle Project you are at.

Take a picture of you and/or your patrol near the marker doing a scout skill and post it on the Mt. Tahoma District Facebook page and or your Troop's page. A list will be distributed/posted on Saturday on the Zoom meeting.

1	N 47.518912 W 122.183865	This is the West Trailhead for the May Creek Trail in Newcastle. You descend a set of stairs to access the trail. To your left at the bottom of the stairs and about 50 yards to the east is a Kiosk with information about the Historic Newcastle Railroad (the Seattle Walla Walla Railroad) and the Large Railroad Trestle that was once at the location. The Kiosk is the Eagle Project of David Vaisar with Troop 499. Adjacent to the Kiosk is a split rail fenced overlook of the Trestle Site with another Information Sign and a bench. This is the Eagle Project for Trevor Skinner with Troop 499.
2	N 47.524435 W 122.149296	This is the Trailhead for the Terrace Trail in Newcastle. You ascend the stairs to the north, the Eagle Project of Zach Burris with Troop 499, and then follow the trail to the east about 1/4 mile to an area of large boulders, "Erratics" deposited by retreating Glaciers. On the left side of the trail is a bench which is the Eagle Project of Boyd Cottom with Troop 499. Boyd installed another bench at the top of the trail as well.

19	Home Storage Center and Bishops' Storehouse	Refinishing and painting parking lot barriers
20	Park at the corner of Se 276th St & 238th Pl SE	Repair park play equipment and spared play bark
21	21730 Dorre Don Way SE, Maple Valley, WA 98038	Sidewalk at Vine Maple Place (Located in the center courtyard)
22	22010 SE 248th Street, Maple Valley, WA 98038	Bench at Maple Valley Community Center (Located in front of Community Center main drive)
23	21700 SE 265TH Way, Maple Valley, WA 98038	Flat Foot Bridge at Cherokee Bay Park (Located in the center of the Park).
