

NYLT FAQs

What is NYLT? National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) is an exciting, action-packed program designed to provide youth members with leadership skills and experience they can use to positively impact their home units in addition to other personal endeavors requiring leadership of self and others.

Who may attend NYLT? Scouts who are at least first class and will be 13 by the start of the course as well as all Venturers, Seas Scouts, and Explorers may attend who have completed Introduction to Leadership Skills for their respective unit . All sessions are co-ed to accommodate both male and female Scouts. A year of camping experience is highly encouraged. A unit leader's recommendation is required prior to registration and his/her name, phone, and email will be collected on the registration form.

Why should I attend NYLT? As a participant, you will take part in many presentations, discussions and activities that explore a wide range of leadership methods and tools. A key area of discovery is team development. By recognizing the stages through which teams evolve, you will learn to apply leadership strategies that enable teams to reach their highest level of performance.

When is NYLT? There are three sessions in 2021: Session 1 is August 9-14; Session 2 is August 11-16; Session 3 is August 16-21. *National standards require* attendance for all 6 days of the course.

What to expect at NYLT

NYLT is a challenging and rewarding six-day learning experience delivered in a troop and patrol outdoor setting with an emphasis on immediate application of learning in a **fun** environment.

Participants from different units are arranged into small groups called patrols, to make new friends, exchange ideas, and travel through the stages of team building together. Scouts BSA participants will be placed in patrols of the same gender. Teamwork is reinforced through activities, presentations, challenges, discussions and working together as patrols throughout the experience.

The NYLT course centers around the concepts of what a leader must **BE**, what he must **KNOW**, and what he must **DO**. The key elements are then taught with a clear focus on HOW TO. The skills come alive during the week as the patrol goes on a Quest for the Meaning of Leadership.

As a participant, it is an honor to be selected by your troop, crew, ship or post to represent them and to interact with other top leaders on course. Our participants remark from year to year how glad they were they attended, how much they learned, the fun they had, and they would highly recommend the course to others.
