Where Ducks Unlimited Works

Delivering Continental Conservation for Wetlands and Waterfowl

Ducks Unlimited takes a continental, landscape approach to wetland conservation. Since 1937, DU has conserved almost **15 million acres** of waterfowl habitat across North America. While DU works in all 50 states, the organization focuses its efforts and resources on the habitats most beneficial to waterfowl.







Maintaining Duck Boxes – A Great Scout Ongoing Activity

What is needed to maintain duck boxes

- Boxes are only used by ducks March thru June
- Boxes are 36” high x 12” wide x 12” deep
- Need to check on and recharge boxes before March or after June / July
- Other animals may live in boxes when ducks not nesting in it
- 2 Areas in Sammamish – Canyon Creek (Duthie Hill) and Hazelwolf

Timeline for Ducks

- March/April – Ducks will start looking for place to nest
- 30-45 days after eggs laid they will hatch
- 2 – 5 days after eggs hatch ducklings will leave box and do not return
- Ducks in the PNW do not always migrate south – depends on local weather
