With our new norm being all on-line, they have created what we think will be a fun, interactive, and challenging event for all scouts in our district. This event will require patrols to work together on many events to show their scouting skills and see who can survive the harsh conditions that lie ahead of us. Registration:

We need all district Troops, Crews, and Ships to register on-line using the link below. Please provide your Unit Number, the number of Patrols you will be bringing, the name of your Patrols, and the name of the scouts attending. We are also asking that you provide 1 adult for each patrol to assist us with being impartial observers only. These adults will be assigned to other flight crews to observe and ensure all safety procedures are followed during the flight.

There is NO Cost to fly with us but when you register, we have Commemorative Flight Patches available for purchase. The patches have a loop on them to proudly hang from their flight uniform pockets. Each patch will cost only \$3.75 and you can order as many as you would like or need. These will be delivered to your unit after your safe return, or at least we hope a safe return.



Your flight will launch at 9:00am on April 24th and will have detailed instructions on your journey and adventures. These challenges will be scored as we are looking for the Most Elite Flight Crew and Unit from our District.

Scoring:

Every celestial challenge will be worth 100 points. The points patrols receive from each station will be added together for one total score. The patrols with the top three final scores will be honored at the end of the day and celebrated throughout our galaxy.

Challenges:

Intergalactic Bounty Hunt:

Here flight crews will complete a list of space-themed, scout-related, or just plain fun activities to gain the most points. Flight crews will receive individual scores that will contribute to an average patrol score. Crew members that do not participate <u>WILL</u> be included in the average. Scouts will need to download the Goosechase app on their phones.

Satellite Communications Array:

Flight crews will face a challenge that will test their communication skills. They must solve problems in order to get their message back to mission control. Every flight crew member will need to know how to work together for this challenge.

Navigation:

Flight crews will have several situations where they must put their navigation skills to the test. They will need to be able to follow directions and traverse an area. They will also be assessed on their mapping skills along with other orienteering-related facts.

Botany Lab:

Flight crews will be simulated as botanists trying to grow plants on a spaceship and will also need to identify plants and weather conditions in-case they are abandoned on an uninhabited planet.

Med-Bay:

Flight crews will demonstrate how well they know their 1st Aid skills. They will be tested on the prevention and treatment of different injuries and illnesses. Flight crews will also be given a 1st Aid scenario for them to mitigate/solve. Flight crews are on their own and need to keep alive!

Aquatic Simulator:

Flight crews will review and test the basics of safe swim protocols, operation of small paddle rafts, rowboats, parts of a boat, and more. Each Flight crew will use a Flight Manual on the app Quizizz that they will need to download. Each quiz will give them different scenarios and ask for the safest approach to solve them.

Of those flight crews that successfully return, three will be recognized, and one will be awarded as the #1 Flight Crew in the District. In addition, one Unit will be recognized for their pre-flight training program as the overall top performing flight crews. Will your crew and unit be there?
