

### **Phase 3 Tent Camping Guidance – Chief Seattle Council Properties**

Tent Camping for units are a rental service provided by the Chief Seattle Council, we provide space for camping. Units are responsible for adhering to the procedures below.

#### **PRE-EVENT WAIVER:**

All participants attending our event will be required to sign a waiver understanding the risk associated with participation.

#### **CAPACITY:**

Units will be required to use campsites in Pods/Cohorts of up to 16 per campsite. The unit will predetermine Pods/Cohorts and be responsible for adhering to this requirement. Each camp will have a limited capacity of participants allowed on site.

#### **MASK POLICY:**

Chief Seattle Council campers and staff must wear masks except when eating, sleeping, showering, and in some program areas such as Aquatics. This policy will be in effect even if vaccinated.

#### **PARTICIPANTS & COHORTS/PODS:**

- Units will need to pre assign themselves to Cohort/Pod size of up to 16.
- Each Cohort/Pod should not intermingle during daytime activities.
- All groups will be encouraged to practice physical distancing (6 feet) as much as possible.

#### **CAMPSITES**

- Campsites will be determined based on number registered. We will provide one campsite per 16 campers.
- It is recommended that units sleep one camper per tent or in the event with a family member they can tent together.
- Adirondacks will be available at available 50% capacity.
- It is recommended that families who tent stay in adirondacks together sleep head to foot.

#### **CLEANING, DISINFECTION, AND VENTILATION**

- Staff will be designated and are responsible for cleaning high touch areas.
- Other high touch areas such as door handles, railings, copy machines, and credit card readers will be wiped down on regular basis.
- Restrooms, breakrooms, lunchrooms, kitchen, and meeting rooms will be cleaned frequently.
- Chief Seattle Council will provide all cleaning chemicals based on recommendation from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)
